English: We will continue to learn and develop our skills as writers of non-fiction and fiction texts. We will continue to extend our understanding of sentence structure and use of grammar, apply known spelling rules and use our phonic knowledge to be brave 'spellers'.

RE: We will be developing our understanding of religions: 'What Kind of King is Jesus?' and 'What matters most to Humanists and to Christians?'

Geography: We will learn about the countries that form the continents of North and South America, and the countries that form them. We will be looking at some of the contrasting regions of the Americas, finding out about the landscape, climate and locations of each area and identify the similarities and differences between a region of the Americas and where we live.

French: We will continue to broaden our vocabulary and develop our ability to understand new words, whilst learning about food.

PE: We will develop our skills in playing competitive games, modified where appropriate and apply basic principles suitable for attacking and defending, we will learn to perform traditional dances and develop flexibility, strength, technique, control and balance in athletics.

Elm Class Year 5 and 6 Term 5 and 6

Maths: We will develop our understanding regarding properties of shape, including identifying regular and irregular polygons, measuring and calculating angles. We will be translating and reflecting objects on a grid and develop our ability to read and write coordinates correctly. We will learn about volume and capacity, be able to convert units of measurement and read, interpret and draw line graphs.

Computing: We will learn how to use different drawing tools to create image and recognise that images in vector drawings are created using shapes and lines. We will learn how to produce 3D models, moving, resizing, duplicating and grouping objects.

History: We will learn about the ancient Maya civilisation including where they lived, their Gods, their number system and the food they ate.

Music: We will learn to create an accompaniment, play a melody and experiment with harmony and learn about high and low registers in singing.

Art: We will learn to use repeated patterns to create a print in the Style of William Morris.

DT: We will learn about weaving and create our own using the Maya as inspiration.


