Dear Parents and Carers,

Here comes Christmas!

Christmas celebrations have clearly now started! As in all households, school is now even busier than normal, but children continue to work really hard alongside the staff. We have already seen a number of events and look forward to experiencing and sharing the rest over the next couple of weeks. Arbor messages will continue to be sent with reminders, so please take a moment to check on these.

We are delighted to welcome a new member of staff to the team: Mrs Zoe Humphrey. Mrs Humphrey will be working in Hazel class, Wednesday to Friday. Beech class have enjoyed working with Miss Kelly: our Brighton trainee teacher. Her placement has now finished but she will be back in the summer term. We have welcomed Miss Vinson, based in Hazel class and Miss Lavender, based in Elm class. They are also Brighton trainee teachers and will be working with us until the end of February.

School crossing: Our wonderful crossing patrol have just asked for a gentle reminder for parents and carers to use the crossing with their children. As we all know the road is always busy, but with the winter days and darker mornings, this is even more important to keep everyone safe. The crossing patrol is a volunteer role, which the Local Authority provide training for. If you, or anyone you know has any capacity at the end of the school day, we would hugely appreciate your support. One of the requirements is obviously to gain a DBS, which is arranged through the local

authority ensuring the volunteer is suitable to work with children. It has been wonderful making stronger links with the local police, who are continuing to try and calm the traffic outside the school, with regular speed watch. The children had all worked hard in school learning a variety of new songs. During the afternoon rehearsal they worked hard to sing as a huge choir of 9 schools under the careful supervision of a conductor and live orchestra. There were also performances from a Glyndebourne Opera singer, the Elite string

orchestra and a marching band, this really was a sensational experience. Thank you to the children, staff, and parents who worked hard to make the event happen.



Oak: Federation Carols Once again - this was a very successful Federation event where the children came together to create a spectacular evening performance. The year 3 and 4 children have been learning a catalogue of Christmas songs that were thoroughly enjoyed by a packed audience in the State Hall, Heathfield. Hazel: Hazel Class have been demonstrating the epitome of our learning power honey bee this week, starting to piece together our Christmas nativity. We have been developing our listening and problem solving skills, taking turns and sharing ideas, reading scripts, singing and improving our acting skills. We cannot wait to share all of our hard work with our friends and families!



We have meet some new characters during phonics - April the

angel, Squashy the wasp, Sky the spy and Cody the jellyfish. Their adventures have supported our writing where we have been writing letters, describing ourselves and







others. We are getting better at choosing the correct sounds for the words we are trying to write now so that we can read it back to ourselves.

In Maths Year 1's have been busy adding, subtracting and comparing numbers and year 2 have had an introduction into using the column method and are starting to think about how we can partition and combine 10s and 1s when we add and subtract.



The children have been having a brilliant time this term learning about the Lyme Regis fossil-hunter, Mary Anning. We have shared the story 'Stone Girl, Bone Girl', written a fact file about Mary Anning's life and discoveries, and enjoyed handling and drawing some real fossils this week. In Art the children have been busy using their collage and painting skills to create dinosaurs for a whole-class dinosaur display.

In Science we have been learning about the basic needs for survival and how different animals and humans meet these needs in different ways. We have been classifying animals using our own criteria, which has been really interesting.



Thank you to everyone who came to our Christmas craft morning. It was wonderful to see the children enjoying themselves making their snowmen, gingerbread men, Father Christmas', Rudolph hats and Christmas stockings! Our shepherds have been added to the nativity display boards in the hall and are looking lovely too.



Attendance: Good attendance really helps the pupils in their social, emotional, and academic learning. Please prioritise attendance at school and talk to us if you or your child has any concerns. We ask Nursery parents to inform the school of any absence in line with school policy, to ensure the school attendance records are accurate. Our target as a school is 96%.
